

**SPRING TOWNSHIP SUPERVISORS**

It was on a motion of David Capperella seconded by Terry Perryman to accept the above positions as read. Unanimously approved motion carried.

#### **HEARING OF VISITORS:**

David Ziegler – Mr. Ziegler reported he was present regarding Blackhawk Road and the lack of maintenance performed on the road. He realized approximately five years ago the Township spent approximately \$40,000 to repair and it was in good condition, however the road now is as bad as it use to be. Mr. Ziegler also reported he doesn't feel he should have to call the office every time something needs done. Reported New Years Day the road needed salted and nothing was done. Gary Royer, Road Foreman, reported the road was done because he personally salted it. Mr. Ziegler disagreed. Mr. Ziegler also reported there is poor visibility at the first bend. According to the "Tree Law" there is to much overhang. The property owner needs to be made aware of by the Township to trim back, otherwise the Township could be held liable if there were to be an accident due to poor visibility.

Terry Perryman, Vice-Chairman, reported this road has been discussed before, he has seen the pot holes and water running and agrees there needs to be more regular maintenance done on the road. Pot holes and water run-off can be taken care of now even if the Township has to rent the proper equipment to do it. Roadway needs a crown on it. Bill MacMath and Gary Royer will check it out and make sure it gets repaired. Gary Royer, Road Foreman, reported he actually has it scheduled to fill pot holes tomorrow. Mr. Ziegler thanked the Supervisors for their time and consideration.

## **OLD BUSINESS:**

## **NEW BUSINESS:**

**Shields Final Land Development Plan & Waiver Requests** – Vaughn Zimmerman, Zoning Officer, reported Lee and Carol Shields are proposing to build a storage facility for RV's in the Penn Eagle Industrial Park on lots 19 and 20. These lots are between the Fine Line warehouse and the unopened Eagle Circle. This project is not intended to have hookups to either public water or public sewer facilities.

At this time, only one minor comment remains from Spring Township review. Don Franson, Engineer, recommends approval of this plan once engineering comments in a letter dated November 30, 2007 have been addressed. Centre County Planning Office comments have been received and are minor in nature. Penn Terra Engineering has not had time to address Centre County Planning Office comments. E & S approval has not yet been received.

Three waivers are being requested on this project. Two waivers are relating to stormwater requirements (Section 304.C and Section 307.B.10). Don Franson has no objection to granting the waivers to Sections 304.C and 307.B.10 of the Stormwater ordinance. The third waiver request is to section 206.2.J of the Subdivision and Land Development ordinance. Developer does not desire to place dumpster facilities on site. At this time, Mr. Zimmerman does not recommend granting of this waiver. Spring Township Planning Commission voted unanimously to recommend approval of both Stormwater waivers, and voted 6 to 1 to deny the waiver to section 206.2.J of the Subdivision ordinance. Planning Commission also voted unanimously to recommend conditional approval of this Final Land Development plan.

Mr. Shields reported this facility is storage only and feels there is no need for a dumpster. With nobody at the location to monitor, having a dumpster could become a nuisance because he feels this would encourage people to dump trash there and leave. Requested the Supervisors please consider waiving.

Terry Perryman, Vice-Chairman, questioned Mr. Shields that if someone has trash where does it go? People parking RV's may have some trash and without a dumpster could create a problem. Mr. Shields reported his concern is with nobody being there to monitor, could create a problem also. Mr. Perryman reported he feels the dumpster is not a bad idea. Frank Royer, Chairman, reported the Centre County Solid Waste Authority can help the Township enforce if it would be abused. David Capperella, Supervisor, reported he can see both sides.

It was on a motion of David Capperella seconded by Terry Perryman to grant approval of waiver requests by Lee D. and Carol J. Shields to Section 304.C and 307.B.10 of the Spring Township Stormwater ordinance, and to deny the waiver request by Lee D. and Carol J. Shields to Section 206.2.J of the Spring Township Subdivision and Land Development ordinance. Unanimously approved motion carried.

It was on a motion of Terry Perryman seconded by David Capperella to grant conditional approval of the Lee D. and Carol J. Shields Recreational Vehicle Storage Facility Final Land Development Plan, plan dated November 21, 2007, last revised December 5, 2007. Conditions being completion of Spring Township comment in letter dated December 7, 2007, completion of Centre County Planning Office comments in review letter dated December 10, 2007, completion of any remaining comments by Don Franson, Spring Township Engineer, approval of E & S plan by Centre County Conservation District, approval by Fire Marshall, lease agreement to contain language on grey water restrictions, and completion of Section 206.2.J of the Subdivision and Land Development ordinance. Unanimously approved motion carried.

**Skyview Meadow Final Land Development Plan** – Vaughn Zimmerman, Zoning Officer, reported CDG Properties is proposing to build 48 townhouse and duplex units on tax parcel 13-3-7B, in the Burnham Farms development. The Preliminary Land Development Plan was previously approved as “Burnham Farms Lot M2” in 2005. The 48 units proposed is within the upper multi-family unit limits set with the Burnham Farms preliminary plan.

At this time, only minor comments remain from reviews by Spring Township and Centre County Planning Office. A few comments issued by Don Franson on December 10<sup>th</sup> remain, and he recommends approval once these comments have been addressed. Developer has already obtained E & S approval for this plan, and a Component 3 Planning Module is not required for this plan as all units were previously approved at the preliminary stage. At their regular meeting on December 17<sup>th</sup>, 2007, Spring Township Planning Commission voted unanimously to recommend conditional approval of this plan.

It was on a motion of Terry Perryman seconded by David Capperella to grant conditional approval of the Final Land Development Plan for Skyview Meadow, plan dated September 19, 2007, last revised November 19, 2007. Conditions of approval being reorientation of the walking path to the intersection of Stonecrest Drive and Valentine Hill Road, extension of sidewalk up Kenlee Drive to the intersection with Stonecrest Drive, completion of comments by Spring Township in a letter dated December 5, 2007 and completion of comments by Don Franson, Spring Township Engineer, in a letter dated December 10, 2007. Unanimously approved motion carried.
